Electricity Load Shedding

We are all seriously affected—and complaining—by what is called "electricity load shedding."

South Africa's electricity is made and distributed by a government-owned utility. For a long time it has not been run properly and is now in very difficult straits. There is simply not enough electricity to meet demand.

So—ESKOM limits electricity distribution by what they call "load shedding."

They announce in advance how many hours a day there will be no electricity. They stagger the hours so that there are rarely more than two hours without power at a time, but there might be 10 hours in 24 (usually 4 hours in a day) when we are without electricity. You can imagine the cries of distress from citizens.

So far this has not hurt our family very mouch. Nothing in our fridges has spoiled. We have battery lights and radio. Brittany is a very good planner and manages to cook good meals. But we all are hoping and praying that things will get much better.
