My advice to the brethren was if there was such a gathering where they are forced to attend on a Sunday, and there was a real danger to their lives if they refuse to attend, they may attend such meetings but then gather later after the meeting to break bread and do other things they are required to do on the Lord's day. There are a lot of disturbances going on at the moment especially in the rural areas. We just pray that these elections may come and go without maiming or injuring anyone. They are due on 23 August.
